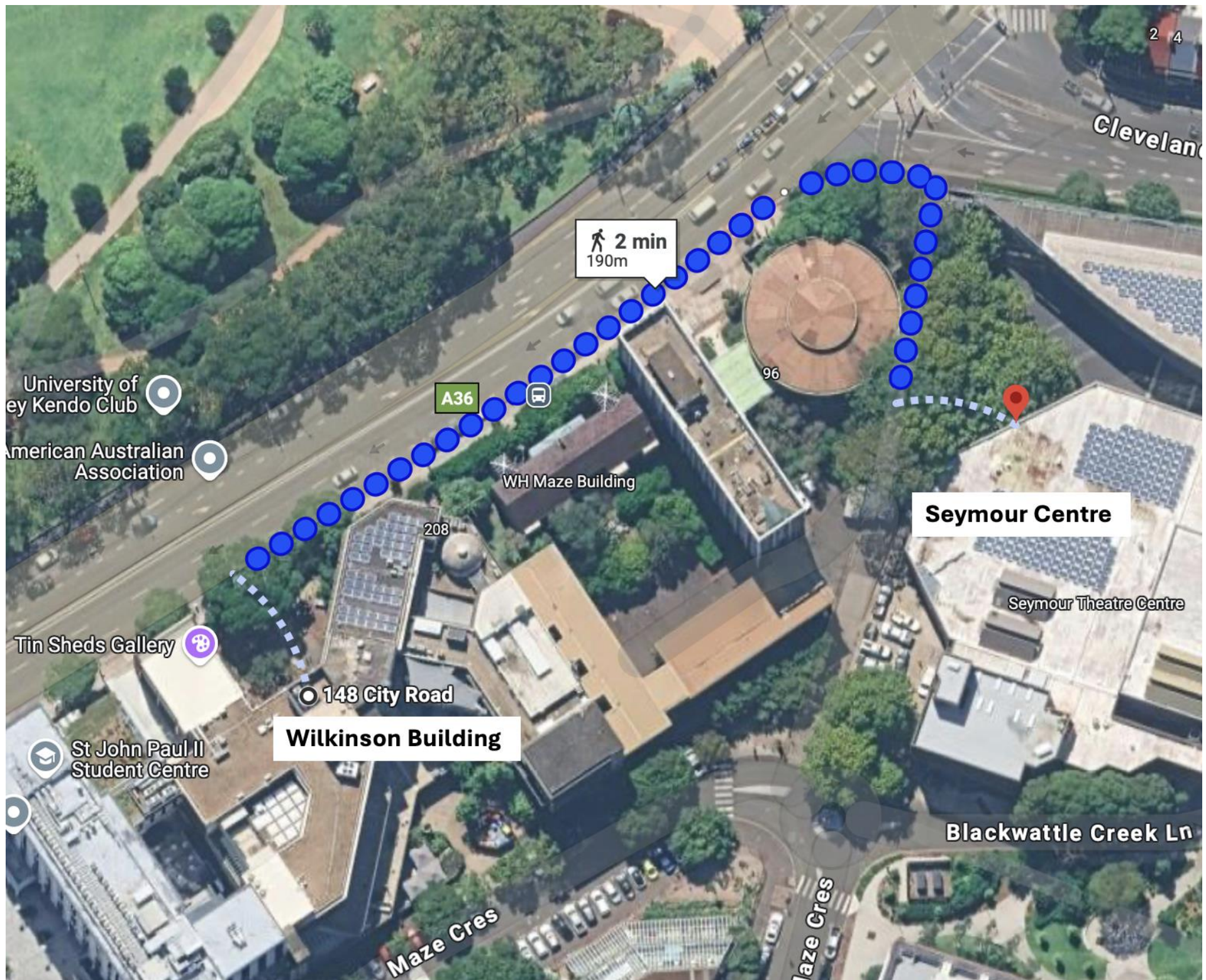

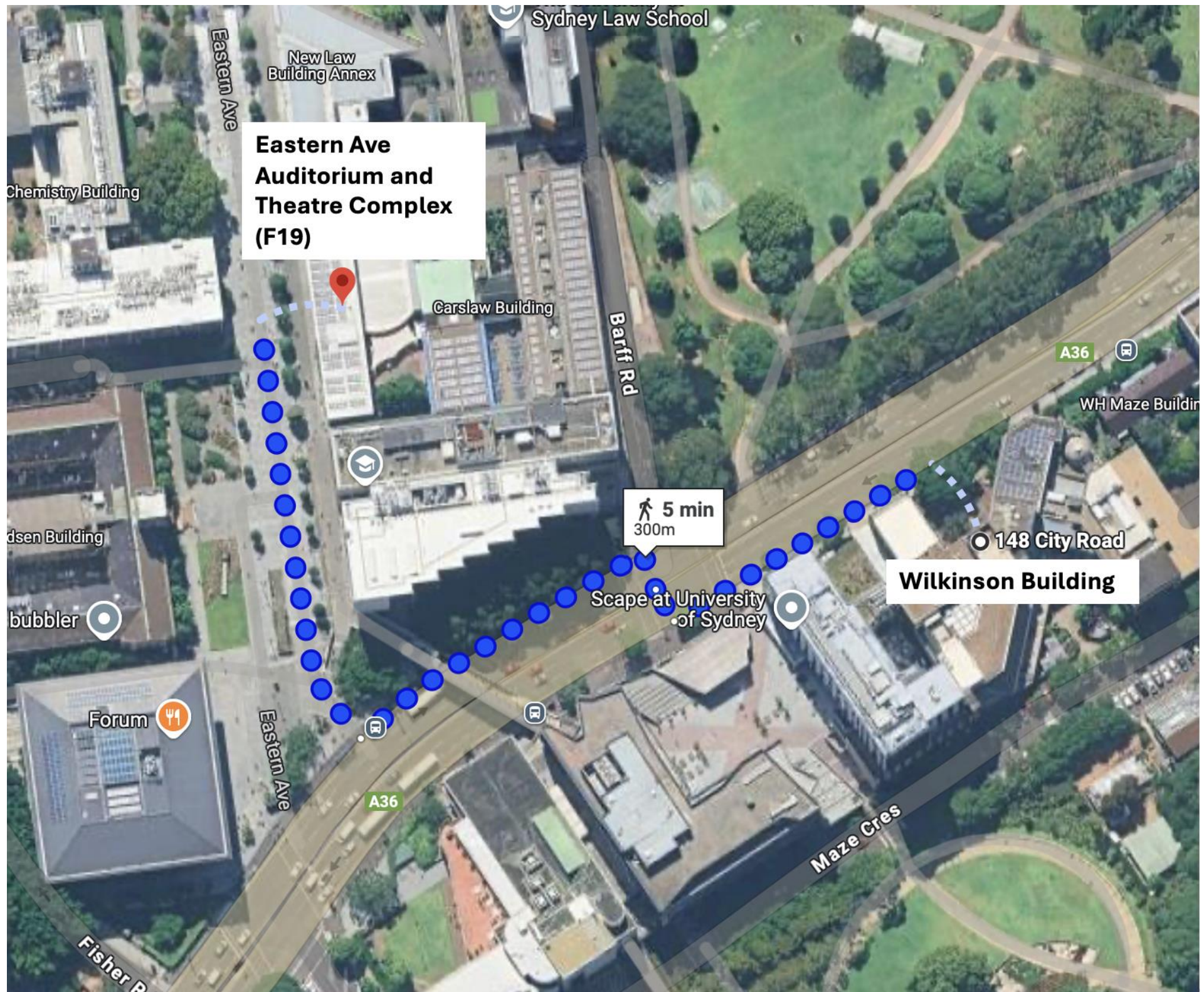


Walking route to Seymour Centre



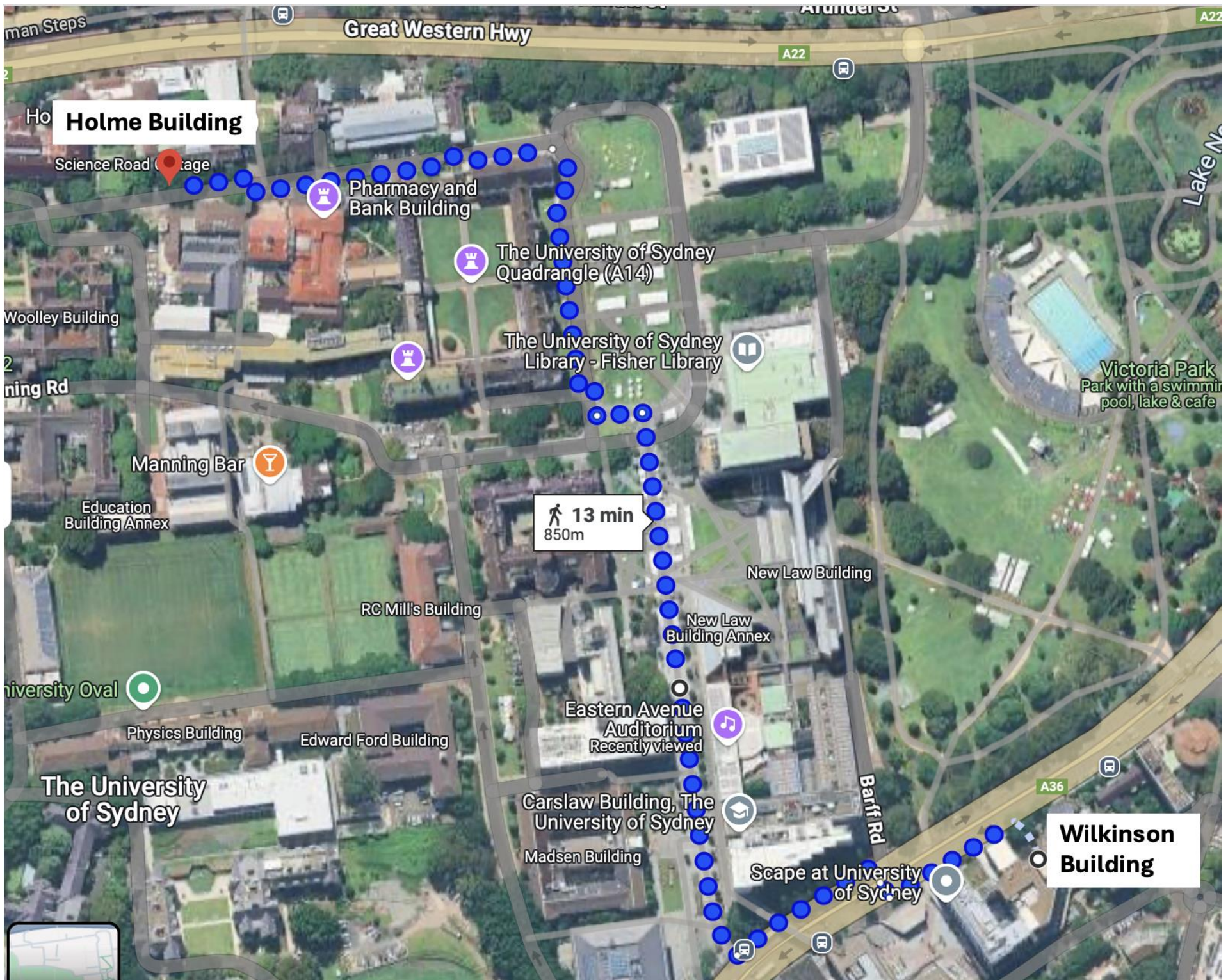


Walking route to Eastern Ave Auditorium and Theatre Complex (F19)
